Letter From The IPI Director



In years past, our elected officials codified their intent for the Iowa Prison Industries program. In a nutshell, IPI is to prepare men and women for re-entry, and to be a self-sustaining program that does not require any appropriations. And the men and women of IPI that operate the IPI program, along with

program participants from around the state, continue to do exactly that – prepare incarcerated individuals, and do so at no cost to Iowa citizens.

This preparation includes the opportunity to enroll in one of more than 20 apprentice occupations such as welding, cabinet making, and powder coat painting – occupations in high demand by Iowa employers. It also entails so-called "soft skills" such as interviewing for a position within the IPI program, communicating effectively with staff and fellow participants, and working together as a team to fill the needs of IPI's many customers at state agencies, schools and universities, healthcare organizations and nonprofit entities.

FY2018 was a difficult year for the Iowa Prison Industries traditional industries program, as orders for dormitory furniture and other wood products fell precipitously, leading to a financial loss of \$872,000 and an 8% reduction

in training hours. And IPI Farms continues to experience lower commodity prices, which led to a calendar year loss of \$198,000. But the declines in these two programs were largely offset by growth in private sector partnerships, where training hours grew by 47%. And fortunately, the program's overall financial position remains strong, as adjustments to operations are being made to accommodate changes in customer needs.

One thing that hasn't changed is the dedication and skill of IPI employees. Our staff provide a security role as they supervise incarcerated men and women, while also training program participants in job skills such as welding or computer operation, and finally in organizing and executing the production of products to meet customer needs. It's a very challenging position, and we are blessed with a talented and hardworking team across the state.

From all of us at IPI, please review and enjoy our FY2018 Annual Report.

Annual Report FY2018 3

Iowa Code §904.801 – Statement of Intent

It is the intent of this division that there be made available to inmates of the state correctional institutions opportunities for work in meaningful jobs with the following objectives:

- To develop within those inmates willing to accept and persevere in such work:
 - **a)** Positive attitudes which will enable them to eventually function as law-abiding, self-supporting members of the community;
 - **b)** Good work habits that will assist them in eventually securing and holding gainful employment outside the correctional system;
 - c) To the extent feasible, marketable skills that can lead directly to gainful employment upon release from a correctional institution.

- To enable those inmates willing to accept and persevere in such work to:
 - a) Provide or assist in providing for their dependents, thus tending to strengthen the inmates' family ties while reducing the likelihood that inmates' families will have to rely upon public assistance for subsistence
 - b) Make restitution, as the opportunity to do so becomes available, to the victims of the offenses for which the inmates were incarcerated, so as to assist the inmates in accepting responsibility for the consequences of their acts;
 - c) Make it feasible to require that such inmates pay some portion of the cost of board and maintenance in a correctional institution, in a manner similar to what would be necessary if they were employed in the community;
 - **d**) Accumulate savings so that such inmates will have funds for necessities upon their eventual return to the community.



Wage Disbursement for Private Sector Inmates






